Worship Information Deadline Change

At the beginning of each week, Pastor Sandy and I meet to debrief the prior week's worship and discuss the direction of the upcoming week's worship. We talk about the scripture texts, the possible direction for the sermon, anything Pastor Sandy particularly wishes to note, and possible special events that need to be incorporated into worship (welcoming new members, blessing someone who is leaving, ordaining and installing officers, commissioning Mission trips, PW Life Members, Graduation acknowledgements, etc.). I then create the order of worship based on our discussions and on information from other sources (music from the organist, choir director, and bell choir director, any announcements or Moments for MIssion that will be included within the worship services). I carefully adjust for the flow and order depending on what the music is and what else is happening that morning.

All this is to say that it is important for me to receive all worship information in a timely manner. The sooner we have information and requests the better. I usually begin working on the order of worship on Tuesday and try to finish before I leave the office on Wednesday. Because I work early in the week, **the personnel committee is asking that all worship information (music, Moments for Mission, special announcements) be received by 10:00 a.m. on Wednesday.** This gives me enough time to work them into the flow of the service. Requests for time during worship (announcements, moments for mission, etc.) will ideally be sent to Mimi in the office and to me (Wendy) and Sandy. Music already goes to all of the musicians plus Sandy, me, Mimi, and Marilyn. This works out well as we all coordinate together.

If information comes later than 10:00 Wednesday morning, we might be able to accommodate a request, but it will not show up in the printed order of worship.

Youth Sunday

Youth Sunday is a long-standing tradition at First Pres, an opportunity for our middle and high school students to prepare and lead a full worship service: writing liturgy, choosing songs, deciding where to include what is familiar and where to bring in new conventions. The whole youth group will work together to decide what the hour will hold, what they want to express, the scripture they want to use, the stories they wish to share. We began discussing youth Sunday on February 23 and will continue planning, writing, and rehearsing on Sundays after worship on March 8, March 29, April 5, and April 19. We invite all 6th-12th grade youth to come join us as we prepare to lead worship on Sunday, April 26.

St. John's Bible Project Presentation

Professor Tim Usher sent us this invitation to an event at Cal State San Bernardino:

You are invited to join us for a presentation by Tim Ternes, Director of The Saint John's Bible Project, on Tuesday, April 28, noon to 1:30 p.m., in PL-5005 (Library Multimedia Center).

Through video, projected imagery, dynamic reproductions and engaging discussion, you will have the opportunity to see, hear, and learn more about this inspirational undertaking.

Guests will have the opportunity to turn the pages on full-size, museum-quality art reproductions of the original and see first-hand the splendor of this work.

The Saint John's Bible is the first handwritten, monumental, illuminated Bible commissioned by a Benedictine monastery in the modern era. It was created by scribes in a Scriptorium in Wales under the artistic direction of Donald Jackson, one of the world's foremost calligraphers and the Senior Scribe to Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth's Crown Office at the House of Lords. The Bible was completed in 2011, and its permanent home is the Hill Museum & Manuscript Library at Saint John's Abbey and University in Collegeville, Minnesota.

The Saint John's Bible incorporates many of the characteristics of its medieval predecessors: it was written on vellum, using quills, natural handmade inks, hand-ground pigments and gild such as gold leaf, silver leaf, and platinum. And yet, it employs a modern English translation (NRSV) as well as contemporary scripts and illumination.

The program is free and open to the public. Parking is \$6.

Light refreshments will be provided.

Prebyterian Women in the Congregation

The Presbyterian Women Coordinating Team met February 3. Moderator Laurie Stafford opened the meeting with a reading from the book, *Space for God;* the selection asked us how much of our lives are we willing to give to God.



Treasurer Nancy Horstmann reported that the Super Bowl Bake Sale netted us \$712. Nancy presented the 2020 PWC budget, and said that Circles are asked as they meet this month to approve the budget. The Team voted to give three graduating seniors at San Bernardino High School scholarships of \$500 each, up from the \$300 given in previous years. There is still money in our funds for LifeSkilz, and this money can be used to help offset the rising costs of breakfasts provided by the Circles.

We also made further plans for our Afternoon Tea, to be held May 9. The Team decided that the charge per ticket will be \$25. Each Circle will provide one or two gift baskets for a raffle, will decorate two tables with fancy china, and will make one tea item to feed 125 people Carol Cooper will provide the music and Laurie Stafford will be the emcee. We will also sell costume jewelry brought in by members and priced by members at \$25, \$10, and \$5.

Our Birthday Gathering will be June 1, with Kristi Van Nostrum, Immigrant Accompaniment Organizer, as our speaker.

Homebound cards will be sent out by Friendship Circle in February, and Grace will provide LifeSkilz snacks.

Debbie has been a member of FPCSB for 12 years where she has served as Elder, volunteered with Kid Space and served with the food ministry. She is currently serving on the Synod of Southern California and Hawaii's Racial, Ethnic Pastoral Leadership committee. Debbie has served at various levels of Presbyterian Women within the PC(USA). She served Presbyterian Women in the Congregation at FPCSB as Vice Moderator and Moderator and is the out-going Moderator of Presbyterian Women in the Presbytery of Riverside. Debbie was on Presbyterian Women's Churchwide New Business Committee (2018) and is currently Presbyterian Women in the Synod's Vice-Moderator of Gatherings and Conferences.

Brooke Dvorak has been a member of First Pres for three years. She is an Elder and serves as chair of the Stewardship Committee. She also does Tuesday morning reception and works with LifeSkillz students.

Brooke worked for Arrowhead Credit Union for 36 years. She began as a receptionist and rose to branch manager and corporate trainer. She describes herself as a "branch opener" because of the large number of branch offices she opened. She has been retired for nine years.

Brooke's family includes her 93 year-old mom, Betty, who lives with her; and two sons and their wives -- Steve and Marina, and Jim and Shelley. Cameron is Jim and Shelley's son and Brooke's only biological grandson, but she has ten other adopted grandchildren. Brooke also has a good friend, John.

How does food ministry work at First Pres San Bernardino?

Where do we get the food?

Feeding America in Riverside - Corporate producers such as General Mills, Pillsbury, etc. donate food to the non-profit, Feeding America, 2950 B Jefferson St., Riverside. F/A, then passes the products on to non-profits like our church for \$.19 per pound. One day each week two volunteers from our congregation pick up groceries pre-ordered from our church computer. Workers at the F/A warehouse assemble the order on a pallet. Our volunteer drivers off-load the products onto their vehicles and bring them back to the church for distribution.

Community Action Partnership (CAP) San Bernardino County's Food Bank is a private non-profit agency at 696 S. Tippecanoe that distributes government surplus food. The food is free to us as one of their distribution sites. On the morning that we do our big monthly bagging, we send four volunteers with trucks at 9:00 a.m. to pick up this food.

How does the food get to people who need it?

Bagging of groceries takes place in Fellowship Hall the Friday before our 3rd Saturday monthly distribution. Two bags per household are prepared. One bag is made up of donations, purchases from Feeding America, and local retail purchases. A second bag is from CAP, the government surplus food. Bagging begins about 8:00 and finishes by 10:30 or 11:00 a.m.

Distribution of groceries to our guests takes place from Fellowship Hall the third Saturday of the month. Guests begin lining up about 6:30 a.m., but volunteers do not arrive until about 8:00 a.m. Any cold or frozen items are removed from the food closet and bagged in plastic bags. Guests are given numbers in the order of their arrival, and at 9:00 we begin to distribute the groceries. Volunteers help carry bags to the cars of guests or help them load the food onto bikes or carts guests have brought with them. We finish about 11:00 a.m. returning any bags unclaimed to the food closet for distribution from the church office during the following week.

Office distribution of groceries is done by the volunteer receptionists in the weeks between our Saturday distribution dates. The bags are pre-packed every Sunday and Tuesday by the Deacons and other members of the congregation under the leadership of the Food Ministry Committee. Guests may receive one of these "emergency bags" per month.

How can I help?

- Donate groceries (canned fruit, canned pasta sauce, and peanut butter are especially welcomed)
- Volunteer to pack bags to be given out through the office (could do it on Sunday or Tuesday)
- Be a "bagger" the Friday before the third Saturday's Distribution (8:00 in Fellowship Hall)
- Help give out food to our guests the third Saturday of the month (8:00 in Fellowship Hall)
- Offer yourself and your vehicle to pick up food at Feeding America (choose your day)
- Offer yourself and your truck to pick up CAP food on "Bagging Day" (9:00 a.m.)
- Use a Deacon envelope in the pew pocket and make a donation to Deacons' Ministry


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
