# Worship in July

In the last year, we have met via pre-recorded services, Zoom, livestream, in Magnolia Courtyad, and in the Fellowship Hall. On June 6, we celebrated our graduates in the Fellowship Hall.

Beginning on the fourth, if the way be clear, we'll be inside on Sundays. (Hymn sing is not advisable and also Curtiss will lead the 4th of July band in Redlands that day, so we will sing "Gather Us In," and focus our worship on gathering rather than on the 4th.)

For the foreseeable future, all services will be livestreamed, so folks can watch safely from home, and also join us from vacation, or the hospital, or...

Eventually we will reinstate singing, but that continues to be challenging in terms of medical data. Some churches have brought back singing by asking that everyone sing with masks on...I am sure we will figure something out in the next few weeks. Meanwhile, the return of the choir is just a delight!!

# **Memorial Service**

A memorial service for Sally Morris will take place in the sanctuary on Thursday, July 1, at 3:00 pm. We will share stories and scripture and hymns; we will share tears and laughter; we will allow God's Spirit to comfort our sorrowing and grateful hearts.

We hope you will be able to join us either in person or from home.

Some details on safety:

- Our sanctuary air circulation and filtration systems have been assessed and upgraded: our exhaust fan refurbished, our HVAC air intake panels fully opened, and all our ductwork meticulously cleaned. We now have very good airflow, which makes the space much safer in terms of viral transmission. Because we will be continually bringing in fresh air, it may be warmer than usual.
- Because we expect many people to attend, some of whom have traveled recently, we will be masking. We will not be as socially distanced as has become standard- we simply do not have the square footage. We will be sitting closer together in order to make room for all.
- If this makes you uncomfortable in any way, please feel free to join us from home – the service will be live-streamed so all can participate fully in a manner that feels safe for them. We love you and want to include you, whatever your situation.

A reception will follow in Fellowship Hall with light refreshments in order to make space for conversation and connection. This may feel risky for some and so we will offer two other options:


• EZup tents for shade and a fan for breeze will be set up in the children's courtyard, with wrapped snacks and water available for



those who would prefer that option. We know being outdoors is always safer, and you are welcome to visit this way if it seems right to you.

Tables will be set up in Magnolia Courtyard so that you may write a note to Pat or members of the Morris family. This
will allow those who would rather not visit with others who are eating and drinking (with their masks off) to convey
their personal love and appreciation to those who have lost the most. A striking feature of Sally's year of illness was
the power of cards to convey Grace that sustained them. Pat and Sally read each card over and over, marveling at
their beauty and simplicity. An offering of notes will allow us to honor Sally's own brilliance at handwritten notes and
allow those who need to take precautions to express their love at this time.

As we close this service we give thanks for all accomplishments, all graduationsthru all the years of our lives. Each represents more than can be contained in one celebration: each graduation represents a journey and unseen strength.

For example: 7 years ago a student came in to LifeSkillz as a freshman. A couple years later, she was hired as our Sunday nursery attendant. After high school, she became a member of our congregation. When she went off to UC Riverside, the Leonard Scholarship Committee gladly invested in her as a first-generation college student. She completed her degree in 3 years because of AP credits she earned while in high school, and her graduation date is this coming Friday.

Her graduation, like so many, will not be what one dreams of. Seeing that attendance was extremely limited, regalia was not free, and her friends were not graduating until next year (so she could not sit with them), this student decided to participate in the online option.

But <u>we</u> wanted to see her in cap & gown and honor her journey- and since we are here in person, we figured we could. So, Alexia Aguilar? Please come here. (Lynda Savage & Bobbi Cummings proceeded to robe her in cap, gown, and tassel, along with custom made stole with her school and year made by Rachel Garvin.)

As the only grad this year who is <u>both</u> a LifeSkillz student and a member of First Pres we Alexia to represent all the graduates we honor today, as we create a 1 minute graduation remembrance moment.

Let the music begin! (William Zeitler began playing Pomp and Circumstance. Lynda and Bobbi pushed Alexia out from behind dividers and she walked to the lectern, turned, and processed up the aisle as the congregation rose and spontaneously applauded. Sandy may have cried a little.)

# Mimi on Mimi

Introduction by Margaret Doane, Stewardship; Answers written by Mimi Lange

I originally asked Mimi for a brief bio before the pandemic when members of several Circles were interviewed for First Pres. This month I asked some additional questions. Mimi's answers are so articulate and so Mimi that they are included in their entirety below, along with the more factual information from the Circle of Faith article.

Mimi Lange has been attending this Church since she began working here as Office Administrator in December 2006, and she and husband Bill became members in 2014.

Mimi has been a member of the choir for five years and a member of the Circle of

Faith for nine years. She has been involved with the Worship Committee, the Stewardship Committee, and the Buildings and Grounds Committee as part of her job, so she notes she "doesn't get volunteer credit for them."

Mimi's husband Bill died in October of 2015, so her family now consists of son Sam; two cats Greebo and Church; and two dogs Allie and Speedy.

Mimi notes that she reads a lot, with "murder mysteries and Terry Pratchett being favorites"; is "very fond of murder TV shows" and romantic comedy movies, as well as off-beat comedies. In the past she has been interested in embroidery, photography, and cooking, but seems "to be more interested in passive pursuits at this time." She occasionally writes poetry, prayers, or prose.

**Brothers and sisters:** I always said I have two and half brothers, the eldest being my half brother Geoff (deceased), who I never met as he was an adult when I was born and he lived in England. (My mother was British.) My next brother, Allen, is ten years older than me, and the youngest brother, Clive, is 7 years older than me. So I was the youngest, the only girl, and the last baby. I was spoiled rotten.

Where you grew up: I grew up in Henderson, Nevada. Near Las Vegas, but not in Las Vegas. We resented being called a suburb of Las Vegas when I was there.

**What schools you attended:** I attended Townsite Elementary and Park Village Elementary (since renamed Robert Taylor Elementary), Henderson Junior High School (since renamed Lyle Burkholder Middle School), and Basic High School (since renamed Basic Academy) all in Henderson. Then I went to United States International University in San Diego for four years, majoring in Musical Theatre Acting. I earned my BFA in 1978.

What Churches you've attended: I grew up with a Church of England mother and a Latter Day Saint father, so I was baptized in the local Episcopal church, but attended sporadically. I attended the local Mormon church with my friends rather more. In eighth or ninth grade, I was baptized in the Mormon church, somewhat to my mother's chagrin. In tenth grade I realized that I didn't actually believe some of the church's tenets, and I wasn't likely to believe them, so stopped attending. (Also, Richard Langford never showed any interest in dating me.) As an adult, I took catechism classes with a Roman Catholic church, but did not ultimately join, and visited many congregations, but never actually joined a church. While married to my first husband, an Army NCO, I started going to the Episcopal Service on Sundays. When said NCO and I divorced, I moved back to Henderson, and began to attend the Episcopal Church in Boulder City, Nevada with friends. I became a member of St. Richard's Episcopal Church in Skyforest when I moved to California in 1992, and at some point transferred my membership to St. Francis Episcopal Church on Sterling Avenue. Our attendance there was sporadic, mostly due to the difficulty of persuading ourselves to get up in time to drive down here for Sunday service. In 1999, I became the church secretary for the Community Presbyterian Church in Crestline, and about a year later, my husband Bill suggested we join. I remained a member there until 2014, when I transferred my membership to this church.

**Interests and hobbies:** Still read a lot, and am currently binge-watching "The Big Bang Theory", which I missed the last several seasons of when it was on CBS. I do a Sudoku every day, and also play a Mahjong type game on my phone. For the past two years, I've been exploring spirituality with groups from Stillpoint, "an open, inclusive community that exists to form deeply grounded spiritual directors, and to live together in a contemplative life of faith, spiritual practice, and action."

**Other jobs you've had:** I have been a box office manager, an actress/stage manager/costume mistress, a paste-up artist, a proofreader, a hotel clerk, a night auditor, a secretary, a church secretary, a bookkeeper, and very briefly, a secret shopper.

What your current job entails: A little bit of all the above? I quote my job description: "The Office Administrator provides administrative and other support services to the pastor, other church staff, and committees and organizations within the church. He/she provides oversight on financial matters including supervision of bookkeeping, payroll, financial documentation, solicitation of vendors for bids and presentation of bids and recommendations to Stewardship Committee. The Office Administrator serves as a conduit of communication from and to church staff, volunteers, members of the church, and those seeking church services."

What you especially like about your current job: Working for a congregation whose members are so overwhelmingly determined to be an embodiment of God's love in this world.

**Anything at all you'd care to say:** This church is such a special place, living out mission in a way that makes me so grateful to be a small part of it. It is one of the greatest blessings of my life to be here.

In this retreat, Rev. Sharon Holt Edwards will guide us through an exploration of neurobiology, body wisdom, and healing work, while Carolyn Foster will offer us creative practices that ease transitions, even welcome ones such as the waning of the pandemic.

During the retreat we will listen and gather in large and small groups to:
